




Physician Alliance Goals

- Improve Risk Coding to enhance our performance in value based care contracts









CareFirst ACO PY2022 Quality Results

We are excited to announce our great performance in the CareFirst ACO Program for PY2022. We ended the year scoring 81% in the adult measures and 81% in the pediatric measures. This was possible by closing gaps in care and through the following initiatives:

United Healthcare Shared Savings Agreement Update

The terms of the United Healthcare shared savings agreement, currently in negotiation, was discussed at the last Contracting Committee meeting on Oct. 11. The committee recommended the board of directors approve a floor for the trend, which was approved at the Board Member meeting on Oct. 27. We are currently awaiting United to respond to our trend proposal. If approved, terms of the shared savings agreement will be sent, and each practice will have the opportunity to opt into the agreement for the next performance period.

The goal is to improve transitional care and reduce readmissions.

Below are the total patient touchpoints and encounters for PY2022:

- Patient Focus Areas: Discharges, Social Needs, High Risk
- Important Care Navigation Interventions: Logistic Support, Self-Management, Assessing for Social Needs
 - 6,778 patient encounters
 - 5,049 patients enrolled in Episodic or Longitudinal care
- Important Priority Outcomes: Readmissions, IP Admissions, ED Utilization, Diabetes
- Additional Needs: Palliative Care and Hospice, Medication Cost, Mental Health Support, Weight Loss Programs, Post Operative Patients
